


RACHAEL LEE // CHOREOGRAPHER



Hi friends! It's your resident meme officer here to share a little bit of my dance journey so far :)

Like several other girls, I started out with routine Ballet lessons around the age of 6. After a year or two, my parents noticed that I was struggling to keep up with the others (or more like I couldn't handle the pain of training my flexibility...) and it wasn't long before I stopped Ballet completely. Slightly disheartened, I believed that I was lacking, and that dance wasn't for me.

From then, apart from the extracurricular beginner hip-hop lessons my primary school had offered for a single term, I never dabbled in the world of dance again, until 2014, when I joined Flare. What initially was an impulse decision became one of the greatest life-changing experiences I've had.

I mustered up all the courage I could find in my timid, unconfident self and dragged my friend with me to a few welcome week classes, the very first being K-pop (which I naturally enjoyed). Having charged straight into this whirlwind of Flare, dance and my first casting with practically zero experience and skill in urban (or any genre for that matter) I wasn't expecting much - I was rejected. At the time, although I was feeling regretful and discouraged, I was fortunate enough to be called back because someone had pulled out (hehe thanks Alana & Djacint). Since then, I've been exposed to coutless opportunities to grow as a dancer/choreographer, partaking in various gigs and production; and further, having the chance to be part of the 2015 committee as Gigs Officer was both memorable and a great learning experience which helped improve my ability to work with professionalism. But my journey is still far from over. Having choreographed for Flare's cocktail night 3 years in a row, I thought it was finally time to step forward and take up the challenge of choreographing for this year's production (which I am extremely excited about!).

If it isn't obvious enough, Flare has played an integral part in my dance journey, and through it I've learnt confidence, I've challenged myself, I've forged many great friendships and created irreplaceable memories that I will continue to cherish for a long time to come. No matter what hardship surface, where I dance, or where life takes me, Flare will always have a spot in my heart as the place I call home.

To all new Flarians, I hope Flare becomes a place full of new experiences, personal growth and most of all, a family with whom you will share the fondest of memories. Don't be afraid to try things you've never done before; casting in particular can be a scary thing, but remember that even failure is just a stepping stone towards improvement, and is something everyone here has been through before. Do approach any of the older members, including myself (I am not scary!) to talk about anything at all. Stick around and I promise you won't regret it!

The first few moments I remember about dancing was when my mom bought me a Carmen Electra's aerobic striptease dance class DVD when I was about 4 or 5 years old. I was so confused but it was so fun LOL. Until today, I still have no idea what went to my mom's head at that time. From that moment on, I've always just been dancing on any possible occasion. From Hip-Hop, Commercial, Indonesian traditional dance, cheerleading, and many more. But I never took any proper class in a studio until 2013 when I decided to enrolled in a dance school called Gigi Art of Dance (GAoD) where I began to learn so much about dance and tried out every genre possible, spent years exploring my own ability and identity through dance. That marked the start of my "officially kind of a dancer" journey because I started to get hired for gigs performances and such, even performing in TV. I kind of stopped dancing because of medschool, but then... I got offered a double degree research program in Melbourne.

The first week in Melbourne, I texted Reba, because I haven't seen him in years. He said, "Come to flare" and so I did. Little that I know, he did not just give me a club to join. He gave me a family, a platform to express my feelings, a place to escape, and most importantly, a home away from home. I came to Melbourne for my medical double degree, yet I spent more time in the studio than in the hospital. I don't know if it's a good thing or a bad thing.

Most importantly, the unexpected friendships that I will cherish forever.


